Process - PAT Caregiver Survey

- 208 Responses
- 190 Electronic (Survey Monkey) and 18 Paper Responses
- 165 English and 43 Spanish Versions
- 17 of 21 PAT Programs (1-32 responses) 38% from eastern WA; 62% from western WA organizations







PAT Caregiver Survey Respondents


- 50% of respondents were in the program between 1 and 2 years
- More than half currently have children between the ages of 2-4 years old
- 72 (35%) of responses indicated Spanish is their primary language at home
- 1/3 caregivers were caring for 1 child, another 1/3 were caring for 2, and over 30% were caring for 3 or more (only 2% were pregnant)








Caregiver Survey: By Language and East-West WA













Caregiver Survey: Electronic or Paper: By Language and East-West WA











Home Visitor Engagement

Focus Groups and Team Meetings

- 5 team meetings and 2 interagency focus groups (September-October)
- 45 participants (7 supervisors, 2 data people, and 36 home visitors)
- 10 HVSA funded programs

Surveys November 2020

- On-line Survey (December)
- 21 respondents: home visitors
- 10 HVSA funded programs



- Incentives








Top 3 Reasons for Participating in PAT – by Language

Top 3 Reasons for Participating in PAT – by Language & East-West













Caregivers: COVID Impacts on Reasons for Participating?








Caregivers: How Helpful Pre-Covid

Helpfulness of PAT on Following Topics, before Covid-19 (sorted on # very helpful)












Caregivers: How Helpful? Top 2 (Pre-COVID) by Language






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Caregivers: How Helpful? Top 2 (Pre-COVID) by East-West WA

Survey (During COVID-19)

- Reduced levels of stress and/or anxiety for self
- Parenting skills/efficacy as a parent

Focus Groups - additional impacts (no Covid-19 reference):

- Parenting skills and tools
- Relationship, trust, connection, attuned interactions
- Mental health supports
- Stress or worry about parenting
- Caregiver mental health








Caregivers: How Helpful PreCovid



Helpfulness of PAT on Following Topics, during Covid-19 (sorted on # very helpful)










Caregivers: How Helpful? Respondents' Top 2 (before & during COVID)


