FAMILY FIRST PREVENTION SERVICE ACT

Qualified Residential Treatment Program (QRTP) Requirements:

- Trauma-informed treatment model, designed to address the identified emotional, behavioral and clinical needs of a child or youth.
- Ability to implement the treatment identified by any assessment(s) or evaluation
- Ability in accordance with the approved case plan to:
 - 1. Engage and include the child's family in the treatment program
 - 2. Facilitate outreach to family and siblings
 - 3. Document the outreach efforts and maintains contact information
 - 4. Document how the family is integrated into the treatment process for the child, including post discharge
 - 5. Document how sibling connections are made
 - 6. Provide discharge planning and family based aftercare support for at least six months (after care services per BRS contract) if appropriate and applicable.
- Licensed clinical staff who:
 - 1. Provides care within the scope of their practice as defined by State Law
 - 2. Are on-site in accordance with the trauma informed treatment model
 - 3. Are available 24 hours a day and 7 days a week
- Licensed or registered Nursing staff who:
 - 1. Provides care within the scope of their practice as defined by State Law
 - 2. Are on-site in accordance with the trauma informed treatment model
 - 3. Are available 24 hours a day and 7 days a week
- Licensed in accordance with state requirements
- Accredited by one of the following independent, not-for-profit organizations:
 - 1. Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF)
 - 2. Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations (JCAHO)
 - 3. Council on Accreditation (COA)
 - Any other independent, not for profit accrediting organization approved by the Secretary

Other Requirements

- To place in a QRTP a child must be assessed by a qualified individual (trained professional) to need a QRTP level of care
- Once in QRTP, within first 60 days of each QRTP placement, the courts shall review the justification for the placement into a QRTP and approval or not approve the placement. This review shall occur at each 6 month case hearing.
- Child in QRTP at 6 months (if under age 13) and 12 month (if over age 13) must be reviewed and approved by the Deputy Secretary of DCYF for continued placement.
