

## HVSA Aligned Measure: Child Maltreatment



Consequences of child abuse and neglect tremendously impact children’s lifelong health, opportunity, and wellbeing if left untreated. The risks of injury, future violence victimization and perpetration, and substance abuse are increased. Consequences of child abuse also include delayed brain development, lower educational attainment, and limited employment opportunities. (CDC, 2021b)

**Measure:** Percent of children enrolled in home visiting with at least one investigated case of maltreatment following enrollment and within the report period.

<b>What to collect:</b>	Personal identification data on the caregivers and the child (e.g., name, date of birth, address) provided the caregiver consents to share this data with the HVSA
<b>For whom:</b>	All enrolled children
<b>When to ask:</b>	Collect the Parental Consent and the identifying data once at enrollment within the first three home visits or update when the status of the consent is changed.

### Measure Production Details

**Calculate:** Percent of children who had at least one investigated case of maltreatment while enrolled in home visiting

<b>Numerator</b>	Number of children enrolled in home visiting with at least 1 investigated case of maltreatment following enrollment and within the reporting period
<b>Denominator</b>	Number of children enrolled in home visiting
<b>Missing</b>	Number of enrolled children missing consent or complete identifying information.

### Required Data Elements:

- Parent consent to share confidential information status
- If consented:
  - Caregiver first and last name
  - Caregiver date of birth
  - Caregiver address (including zip code)
  - Child first and last name
  - Child date of birth
  - Child ProviderOne (Medicaid) number
