## **Role Determination Chart**

## Outdoor Nature-Based (ONB) Programs

Your job titles do not need to match Washington Administrative Code (WAC) roles. Consider what a person does and select the role in the WAC that best fits their responsibilities.

You do not need to change the title you use at your program, but you do need to have accurate staff records in <u>MERIT</u>. The role indicated in <u>MERIT</u> will determine the staff qualifications and training for that person. Here is a summary that may be useful when making a role determination for your staff:
